## Improving Classrooms

We have recently been awarded a grant of £2.88m by the government towards the cost of building seven new Biology and Chemistry laboratories. These will replace the temporary Chemistry building erected over 50 years

ago. We also plan to refurbish our current Biology laboratories for use as general classrooms to replace the temporary classrooms at the rear of South House, which are nearing the end of their useful life.

Once finished, the new laboratories and refurbished classrooms will give us much needed extra teaching space and will provide an improved teaching and learning environment for boys and staff. They will also enable us to provide more practical teaching sessions in biology and chemistry and better preparation areas, so that teachers have adequate space to prepare for lessons. As a result, we will be able to give boys the best possible teaching in these subjects, particularly those who wish to study medicine or the sciences at university.

### Goals for 2014-15:

- Build seven new Chemistry and Biology Laboratories
- Refurbish four classrooms for general teaching
- Raise £250,000 for equipment and furniture



We are aim to start building in Spring 2015, and to finish in early 2016. We still need to raise the cost of equipment and furniture, as the government grant only covers building costs. In order to meet our target, it is crucial that we gain as much support as possible from the School community. Your gift, whether a single payment or a regular donation would be invaluable in building an even better Reading School.

### **Enrichment Activities**

Enrichment activities are an essential part of the education that we offer at Reading School. They are an important counterpoint to academic work and enable boys to develop the skills that will enable them to

become leaders in their communities. Developing resilience, self-reliance, and empathy, as well as communication, team work and leadership skills through enrichment activities are key to helping them fulfil their potential.

Activities also enable boys to discover their own strengths and preferences and to build a wide friendship group, so that they can move onto university and employment as proactive, confident and independent young men, capable of making a valuable contribution, whatever their chosen career.

We provide over 50 enrichment activities throughout the year, including:

- 6 Art, Drama and Debating Clubs, including animation and public speaking
- 9 Music Groups, including 4 choirs, 3 bands, and 3 ensembles
- 17 Sports Teams, such as football, rugby, lacrosse, cricket, rowing, chess, badminton and triathlon club
- **12 Clubs and Societies**, including Computing, Science, Gardening, Astronomy, Geography, French, German and Enterprise
- 9 Spirituality and Discussion groups, including philosophy, Christian Union, current affairs and our Inspire Lectures on a wide range of topics
- 3 Service Activities Combined Cadet Force, Duke of Edinburgh and Community Service
- 19 House competitions in sports, enterprise and music



Most of activities are run voluntarily by staff who give up their time to support the boys. However, there are some extra costs that can't be met from public funding alone. Each year we need to raise approximately £100 per student to ensure that we can cover the costs of transport, materials and specialist training.
