## Protect Your Personal Info

You never know who you're *really* speaking to online, so never give out your real name, address, phone numbers, photos and school. Giving away your personal info could lead to you being scammed, bullied or put in danger.



## Protect Your Privacy

Keep your Email, Skype, MSN, Facebook or other details private. You never know where it might lead you....



## Don't Give In To Peer Pressure

Just because everyone else seems to be doing it, if you're not comfortable with it, don't do it!



## Keep Your Pals In Pixels

Never meet up with people you only know from the internet, people aren't always who they claim to be. If someone asks you to meet with them tell your parents, your teacher or another trusted adult.

## Don't Be Scared To Speak Up

If someone online is making you feel uncomfortable or even scaring you with threats, tell someone about it immediately – your parents or teacher – or go onto the CEOPS website and report them.



## Ban The Cam

You have no control over your photos and webcam images once you share them over the internet and you can't get them back. They can be shared with anyone, anywhere and be used to bully or blackmail or threaten you. Before you post a pic, ask yourself, are you comfortable with people you don't know viewing it?



## Be A Smart Surfer

Some websites can pretend to be what they are not, like offering updates to your favourite games or apps or offer you free offers if you enter your login details on this "special" page..... These are all scams designed to steal your user names or passwords. Don't give them your details and never download files from them; they could be key loggers or even viruses
