Read:

- Rick Riordan - many books from the series are available in the LRC (and almost certainly your local library), including:
Percy Jackson and the Lightning Thief:
Twelve-year-old Percy Jackson is on the most dangerous quest of his life. With the help of a satyr and a daughter of Athena, Percy must journey across the United States to catch a thief who has stolen the original weapon of mass destruction — Zeus' master bolt. Along the way, he must face a host of mythological enemies determined to stop him. Most of all, he must come to terms with a father he has never known, and an Oracle that has warned him of betrayal by a friend.
Greek Heroes:
Who cut off Medusa's head? Who was raised by a she-bear? Who tamed Pegasus? It takes a demigod to know, and Percy Jackson can fill you in on all the daring deeds of Perseus, Atalanta, Bellerophon, and the rest of the major Greek heroes. Told in the funny, irreverent style readers have come to expect!
The Trials of Apollo:
How do you punish an immortal? By making him human. After angering his father Zeus, the god Apollo is cast down from Olympus. Weak and disoriented, he lands in New York City as a regular teenage boy. Now, without his godly powers, the four-thousand-year-old deity must learn to survive in the modern world until he can somehow find a way to regain Zeus's favor. But Apollo has many enemies—gods, monsters, and mortals who would love to see the former Olympian permanently destroyed. Apollo needs help, and he can think of only one place to go . . . an enclave of modern demigods known as Camp Half-Blood
- Roman Mysteries by Caroline Lawrence - many books from the series are available in the LRC (and almost certainly your local library), including:
The Thieves of Ostia:
Flavia Gemina is a natural at solving mysteries. The daughter of a ship's captain living in Ostia, the port of Rome, in AD79, she and her three friends, Jonathan, a Jewish boy (and secretly a Christian); Nubia, an African slave girl; and Lupus, a mute beggar boy, must work together to discover who is beheading the watchdogs that guard people's homes, and why.
- Homer's Iliad and Odyssey by Gillian Cross - available in the LRC:
Homer's Iliad
The Spark: It begins with a seemingly small dispute—a golden apple and a beauty contest—that spirals into a bitter ten-year war after Prince Paris abducts Helen of Sparta.
The Conflict: Outside the golden city of Troy, gods observe from Mount Olympus while brave heroes clash. But the violence isn't just on the battlefield; a petty, prideful quarrel between the Greek kings Achilles and Agamemnon threatens to destroy the army from within.
The Theme: A tale of human bravery, the heartbreak of war, and the devastating consequences of pride.
Homer's Odyssey
The Journey: It details the incredible ten-year voyage of Odysseus, the cleverest king of ancient Greece, as he struggles to cross the "wine-dark sea" and return home to his family.
The Obstacles: His journey is packed with human endurance, terrifying monsters, and unknown dangers.
The Homefront: While Odysseus braves the wrath of the sea and the gods, his wife Penelope waits in Ithaca, holding off rival suitors in hopes of his return.
- Daughter of Darkness by Katharine and Elizabeth Corr - available in the LRC [part of a series]:
"Daughter of Darkness" by Katharine and Elizabeth Corr is a YA Greek mythology fantasy following Deina, a Soul Severer who shepherds the dead for Hades. Desperate for freedom, she joins a perilous Underworld quest to retrieve Orpheus's dead wife, Eurydice. The team must navigate deadly traps and questionable loyalties to survive.
- Pegasus and the Flame by Kate O'Hearn - available in the LRC [part of a series]:
When Pegasus crashes onto a Manhattan rooftop during a blackout storm, 13-year-old Emily's life changes forever. Thrust into a war between Roman gods and the Nirads (multi-armed stone warriors), she, her friend Joel, and the goddess Diana must save Olympus before its magical flame burns out.

- The Impossible Gladiator by M.G, Leonard:
When world-famous illusionist Kinetic disappears during a live broadcast from the Colosseum, Sim, Jeopardy, and Nelson find a historical clue suggesting he is trapped in the past. The trio must navigate secret time doors to the dangerous world of Ancient Rome to rescue him.
- Time Riders Gates of Rome by Alex Scarrow - available in the LRC [part of a series]:
Gates of Rome follows a disastrous "Project Exodus" mission, where 300 modern Americans sent to 54 AD instead arrive early during Emperor Caligula's reign. With Maddy and Sal hunted by a kill-squad, the TimeRiders are trapped in the past while Caligula uses future knowledge to increase his power
- Gladiator Fight for Freedom by Simon Scarrow - available in the LRC [part of a series]:
Gladiator: Fight for Freedom is a historical adventure novel by Simon Scarrow. It follows young Marcus, whose father is murdered and mother sold into slavery. Enslaved and forced to train as a gladiator, Marcus plots to escape, avenge his father, and expose a secret that could free all slaves.
- Who let the gods out by Maz Evans - available in the LRC [part of a series]:
Elliot's life is spiraling out of control—his home is under threat and his mum is seriously ill. But everything changes when a shooting star crashes onto his farm. The "star" is Virgo, a young Zodiac goddess on a mission. Together, they accidentally unleash Thanatos, the evil daemon of death. To stop him, they must call on Zeus and the long-retired Olympian gods for help.

Accessing resources from the LRC

Using the LRC Before Reading Week

- By the start of October half-term, all year 7, year 9 and year 12 pupils will have been invited to the LRC to discover the range of resources available to them both within school and from home.
- New students should have received a Guide to Using the LRC.
- All pupils can borrow books from the LRC for Reading Week.

E-Resources Available From Home 24/7 The LRC subscribes to a range of high quality e-resources that can be accessed from home. An alphabetical list, complete with links and login details can be found on here <https://readingschoolco.sharepoint.com/SitePages/LRC%20E-Resources.aspx> This includes two **ebook** platforms. Both platforms can be accessed using pupil Office 365 logins:

VLeBooks is a small ebook library and provides access to both fiction and non-fiction ebooks. Books can be read online. You can access VLeBooks via this link www.vlebooks.com. This includes 6th form wider reader titles. You can also preview books we do not own.

ePlatform by Wheeler's is our new ebook and audiobook platform found here: <https://readingschool.eplatform.co>

The ePlatform library catalogue is full of bestselling, popular fiction titles. Students can have 2 books out on loan at any one time, and they will automatically return after 2 weeks, or students can return them early in order to loan a new book. The eBooks can be read on a computer, laptop, or through the free App on your tablets or smartphones.

Reading through your web browser on a laptop or computer

Students can browse the collection or search for a specific book title, author or publisher and loan the book they choose. It is then assigned to them for the 2-week period.

Reading through the App

To download the App, search “ePlatform” in the App store and download. Click on the app and you will then need to search for the library which will be **Reading School**. Once you start typing, it will bring up the school on the list. Click the 3 little lines in the top left corner and select sign in. Using the App, the books will be temporarily downloaded to the device so students will not need internet connections once the book has been loaned to read, great for travelling!
