# Entry into Year 12 in September 2019 Guidelines for completing the online registration form

#### THE REGISTRATION PROCESS

- Online registration opens on Saturday 1<sup>st</sup> December 2018 and closes at midday on Friday 25<sup>th</sup> January 2019.
- The link to the online registration form can be found on our website: Sixth Form Application Form
- In order to submit a registration form you will need:
  - A valid email address
  - Access to a computer or tablet and connection to the internet. Please note registration cannot be completed from a mobile phone.
- If you do not have access to a computer or a tablet to complete the online registration form, please contact the admissions office at Reading School.

  - Applications will not normally be accepted from any boy whose date of birth is before 1<sup>st</sup> September 2002
  - Applications will not normally be accepted from any boy whose date of birth is after 31<sup>st</sup> December 2003
  - ➤ Only in exceptional circumstances will applications be accepted from any boy whose date of birth is before 1<sup>st</sup> September 2002 or after 31<sup>st</sup> December 2003. Boys should normally be studying in Year 11 (or equivalent) at the time of application. Please contact the admissions office should you have any questions relating to the date of birth.

# Day or Boarding:

Please note that applicants can only apply for day or boarding only and not both.



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# **Applicant's Address:**

- Reading School operates a designated area as part of its oversubscription criteria. The designated area is determined by the postcode of the applicant's home address.
- The designated area consists of all postcodes starting with:

- Applicants will be ranked according to their predicted points score. All applicants predicted 54 points
  or more who are applying for a boarding place or who live within the designated area and are applying
  for a day place will be ranked in the following order and within each category strictly by their predicted
  points score:
  - i) The applicant is a looked after child or previously looked after child
  - ii) Children of members of the UK Armed Forces eligible for service premium (boarding applicants only).
  - iii) The applicant has a boarding need (boarding applicants only)
  - iv) The permanent home address of the student is within the designated area of the school and the student is in receipt of pupil premium. Documentary evidence that the parent has been or is in receipt of the appropriate support payment entitling the child to free school meals/service premium will be required.
  - v) The permanent home address of the student is within the designated area of the school and this home address is the address of the parent(s)/carer(s) and the student.
  - vi) Students whose home address is NOT in the designated area of the school.
- A waiting list ranked as above will be used to offer further places if any original offers are declined.
- Every effort will be made to accommodate students who meet the entry requirements for a place in Year 12, but applicants should appreciate that some subjects may become full in which case we will operate a waiting list. This will be most relevant to applications received after 25<sup>th</sup> January 2019.
- For Day applicants, the designated area is determined by the postcode of the student's home address. Places will be offered to applicants who reside within the designated area by the sixth form registration date (27th August 2019) following the GCSE results. This must be the student's permanent home address with their parent(s) / carer(s), e.g. the address where the student is registered with a GP. In the cases where parents have shared responsibility for a student, the permanent address will be where the student stays for the majority of the school week (Monday to Friday) and the school may ask for documentary evidence to support the application. Boarding applicants may reside outside of the

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## Designated Area.

Students for day places from outside the designated area will only be considered if all the available
places cannot be filled by students from within the designated area or by boarders. The exception to
this is if the applicant's family are returning from abroad to a previous home within the designated area,
are Crown Servants or members of the Armed Forces (documentary evidence will be required to
support this).

If this is the case, please select 'Yes' in the 'Exception applying to you' box and send in documentary evidence to support your claim.

  more and who is living within the designated area (for a day place) will be given a conditional offer.
- If you are eligible for any of the above, please select the appropriate choice in the drop down
- Reading School will request evidence of the above from the applicant's current school.
