

### Chris Bradford Virtual Author Talk to Launch Book Week 2021

Author, Chris Bradford, will be giving a virtual talk to pupils at Reading School on **Friday 26th of February at 2.30pm**. The talk is open to all years, but places are limited and must be booked using this form: <http://bit.ly/ChrisBradfordTalk2021>. Chris will be talking about his brand-new book, *The Soul Hunters*.

Chris Bradford's best-selling books are published in over 20 languages and have received more than 30 children's book award nominations, winning among others the Northern Ireland Book Award 2011, Hampshire Book Award 2014, the Brilliant Book Award 2014, and the Quick Read 2017. Young Samurai: *The Way of the Warrior* was deemed one of Puffin's 70 Best Ever Books, alongside *Treasure Island* and *Robin Hood*.

For his award-winning Young Samurai series, he trained in iaido (samurai swordmanship), karate, ninjutsu and earned his black belt in Zen Kyu Shin Taijutsu. Previously he has trained in judo, muay thai and kickboxing. For his *Bodyguard* series, Chris embarked on an intensive close protection course to become a qualified professional bodyguard. During his training, he acquired skills in unarmed combat, defensive driving, tactical firearms, threat assessments, surveillance, and even anti-ambush exercises.

The LRC Book Club interviewed Chris last year in connection with *The Return of the Warrior* which was nominated and shortlisted for the Reading School Book Award 2020. You can watch our interview [here](#).


#### The Climb

# Integrity

## Generic parental consent for offsite activities

When students take part in any off-site activities; the contact information, medical details and dietary requirements held on the School's database will be used.

## Local Learning Area visits

The school has a defined 'local learning area'. Visits leaving the school site and utilising this local area (see the [Educational Visits Policy](#) for the defined area) are considered to be an integral part of the curriculum. These visits are planned and delivered by school staff, may involve minibus or other forms of approved transport and are delivered free of charge.

Parents will be informed of any Local Learning Area visits.

Where these visits take place within the school day your consent is assumed unless you have explicitly asked to opt out, via email, to the Visit Leader.

## Activities taking place beyond the normal school day

Parents will be informed of any visit taking place beyond the normal school day and additional consent will be sought.

## PE lessons

Due to the varied and expansive PE curriculum that Reading School seeks to deliver, we make use of a range of locations within our Local Learning Area, such as, but not limited to: Reading University Sports Park, Rivermead, Palmer Park and our own playing fields at Morgan Road.

All PE lessons, including those offsite are delivered by school staff. Offsite lessons may involve students being transported using a school minibus or other forms of approved transport. You will not be informed of the individual PE lessons that take place offsite.

Your child's participation in the full PE curriculum is assumed unless you have **explicitly asked to opt out**.

## Whole School Events

For whole school events such as the annual Commemoration Service at St Mary's Church, or Sports Day at Palmer Park you will be informed via the weekly Headmaster's Bulletin and website of arrangements and these events will run on an opt-out basis, with attendance assumed unless the school is notified in writing.

Your consent to these changes will continue unless you wish to opt out, in which case, please email: [dtridgell@reading-school.co.uk](mailto:dtridgell@reading-school.co.uk) with your child's full name, tutor group and advise that you wish to opt out of the generic consent. Opting out will mean you will need to complete a consent form for each off-site activity which takes place during the school day.
