Adverse Weather Plan

Reading School will endeavour to stay open for as many pupils as possible for as long as possible.

Reading School will aim to return to normal practice as soon as is safely possible during any period of adverse or inclement weather.

Reading School advises that parents should consider the safety of their sons when travelling to school when there are inclement weather conditions forecast.

Reading School will restrict its opening if in the opinion of the Headmaster and based on the information, advice and guidance available to him at the time if the risk to pupils, parents and staff from travelling in to school is too great.

Please note the following sources of information that you will need to monitor during periods of adverse or inclement weather:

- 1. The school website: www.reading-school.co.uk
- 2. Notification by email and text please ensure that Reading School holds a current email and mobile number for you and that you have consented to receive communication via SchoolComms, our school communication system.
- 3. Local Radio Radio Berkshire and Heart FM

Reading School will always do its best to remain open and any decision on closure would be made on the basis of the safety of pupils and staff.

If the school needs to be closed part way through the school day, day pupils will be dismissed following communication via the school website and via SchoolComms.

Unless you confirm in writing to <u>secretary@reading-school.co.uk</u> by Wednesday 5th January 2022 that you <u>do not</u> want your son to be dismissed in the event of closure during the school day, we will assume that you agree to your son making his own arrangements to go home.

It is expected that Boarders will remain on site in the Boarding Houses, supervised by resident staff if the school is closed. An exception would be if the closure was expected to continue up to the weekend or if travel arrangements home are significantly complicated.
