Music	Listening Paper – Full paper. All questions follow an audio CD played outloud. Questions 1 – 6 – listening questions on set works studied Question 7 – Music dictation (fill in the missing rhythm/melody) Question 8 – Unfamiliar piece listening questions (style will be related to one of the set works studied) Question 9 – Essay – compare a set work to a similar unfamiliar piece. The question will ask you to focus on a couple of musical elements (melody, harmony, tonality, instrumentation, dynamics etc.)	Revision Ensure your anthology is filled with relevant annotations for each set work and try to remember key features about each piece. Consolidate terminology by categorising them by their musical element.
PE	A 90 minute exam which is a combination of the 2 papers that will be sat in the summer. The Human Body and Movement (paper1) Socio-Cultural Influences and Wellbeing (paper2). Multiple choice, single and 2-mark questions (AO1 Knowledge). Larger 4-mark questions needing examples (AO2 Application). Physics	Topics P1-P7: The entirety of the course content covered to date. Paper will be a mixture of multiple-choice questions, calculations, and extended response questions, just as in the format of the GCSE exam.	
Religious Studies	The Religious Studies exam will include 2 essay questions. Question 1 will be drawn from the 'arguments for God's existence' section on the Philosophy of Religion. Students need to revise the teleological, cosmological, ontological and religious experience arguments in preparation for Question 1. Question 2 will focus on the topic 'Augustine on Human Nature' which is the first component of this years' work 'developments in Christian theology.	Revision summaries and exemplar essay plans for all topics are found in your class files area on your T&P team. The best way to revise is to practise writing a 30 minute essay on each topic.
