

Excellence in Biology

Intermediate Biology Olympiad 2023

The Biology Department would like to congratulate the year 12 students who participated in the 2023 Biology Intermediate Olympiad. Reading School students achieved 6 Gold, 13 Silver and 9 Bronze awards.

The Intermediate Olympiad is an on online competition run by the Royal Society of Biology (<u>Royal Society of Biology</u> (<u>rsb.org.uk</u>)). It consists of an online 60-minute paper with questions on the topics covered in most general AS level biology courses but also rewards those students, whose knowledge of the subject has been increased by reading books and magazines, watching natural history programmes and taking notice of the news media for items of biological interest. Over 14000 students from 700 schools worldwide had participated this year.

Biology Challenge Award Winners 2023

Year 9 and 10 Biology

Congratulations to Year 9 and 10 Biologists who achieved an impressive **45 Gold**, **32 Silver and 81 Bronze awards** in the **2023 Biology Challenge** run by the Royal Society of Biology. 41,000 students from 550 schools worldwide had participated this year. To achieve a Gold award a score of 87% was required this was awarded to the top 5% of participants. The competition consisted of two, twenty-five-minute multiple choice papers to be taken online under staff supervised exam conditions. Questions were set on the school curriculum, but the competition also rewards those students whose knowledge of the subject has been increased by reading books and magazines, watching natural history programmes, taking notice of the news media for items of biological interest, and are generally aware of our natural flora and fauna.

Biology Challenge – UKBC (ukbiologycompetitions.org)

The Biology Challenge stimulates students' curiosity for the natural world and encourages them to take an interest in biology outside of school.

After a very successful German play in April, on Friday 7 July our Year 9 and 10 students were privileged to watch a Spanish play by Onatti. The French play will take place in November.



Last Tuesday 4th July we were delighted to host the Appraisal Team from Reading City of Sanctuary to assess Reading School against the criteria for the School of Sanctuary award which we have been working towards.

We are delighted to announce the Appraisal Team have awarded us School of Sanctuary status and confirmed that we met or exceeded all of the criteria. This makes us the very first School of Sanctuary in Reading.

Becoming a School of Sanctuary confirms our commitment to the Learn, Embed, Share vision:

- Learn To raise awareness about what it means to be seeking sanctuary
- Embed To take positive actions to embed concepts of welcome, safety and belonging within the school community, including in school practice, provision and culture. To take steps to ensure these steps remain sustainable into the future
- Share To share our vision and what we have learnt with the school community, other schools and local community. Working in partnership with people, organisations and intuitions in the wider community to build a culture of welcome that extends beyond the school gates.

A final quote from the appraisal team: "Becoming a School of Sanctuary is not an easy task, and requires a whole school effort and requires going above and beyond statutory requirements - and Reading School has provided an exceptional example of what being a School of Sanctuary is all about"

Thank you to all the school staff, students and parents who have helped to organise and participate in our efforts this year. Thank you also to the staff at Reading Refugee Support Group for their invaluable guidance when shaping our plans this year.

Year 8 Charity Fundraising


