Uniform - with effect from Monday 24 June 2024

As the weather warms up, and with forecasts for a sustained period of high temperatures, students are not required to wear blazers to school, whilst at school or on their way home. If students do choose to wear an outer layer, however, it should be their blazer.

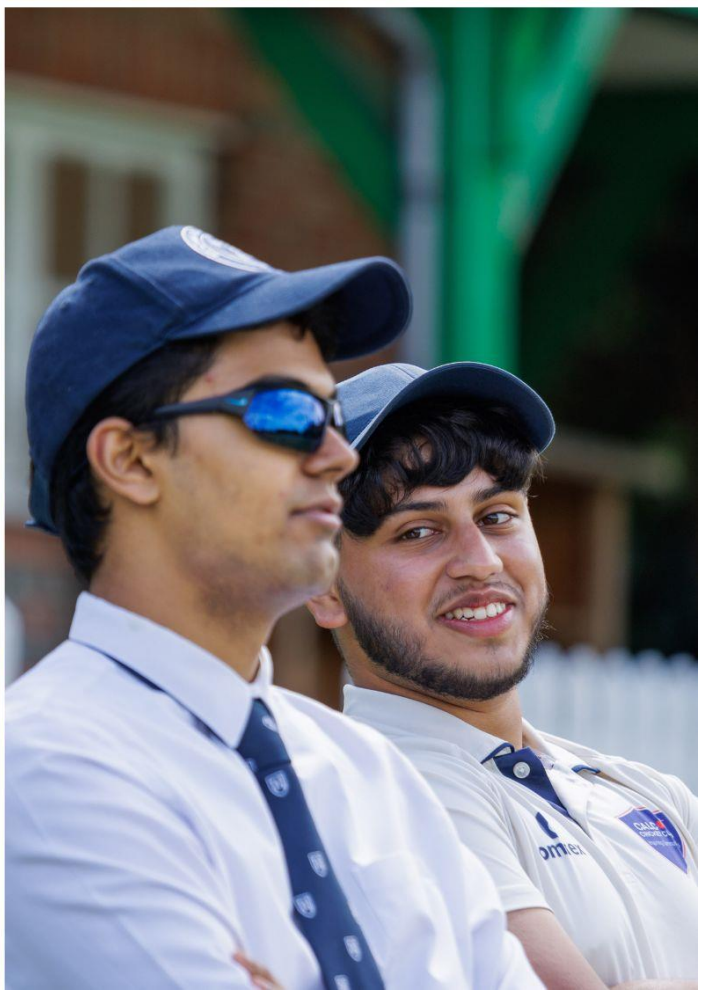


Reading School vs Marylebone Crickey Club (MCC)

Did you know that the Reading School vs Marylebone Cricket Club (Lord's Cricket Ground) annual 1st XI fixture has been taking place since 1898









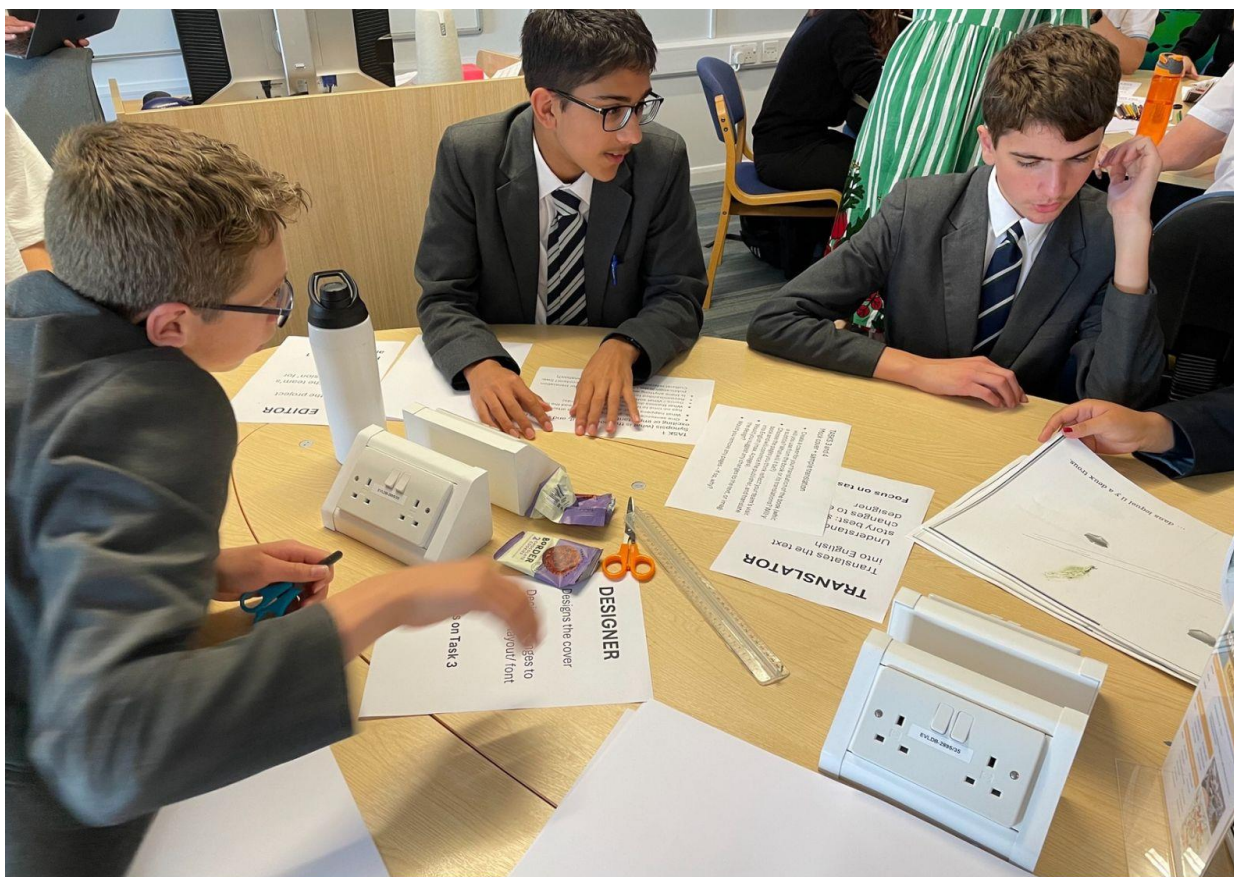


MFL Participation Day Event

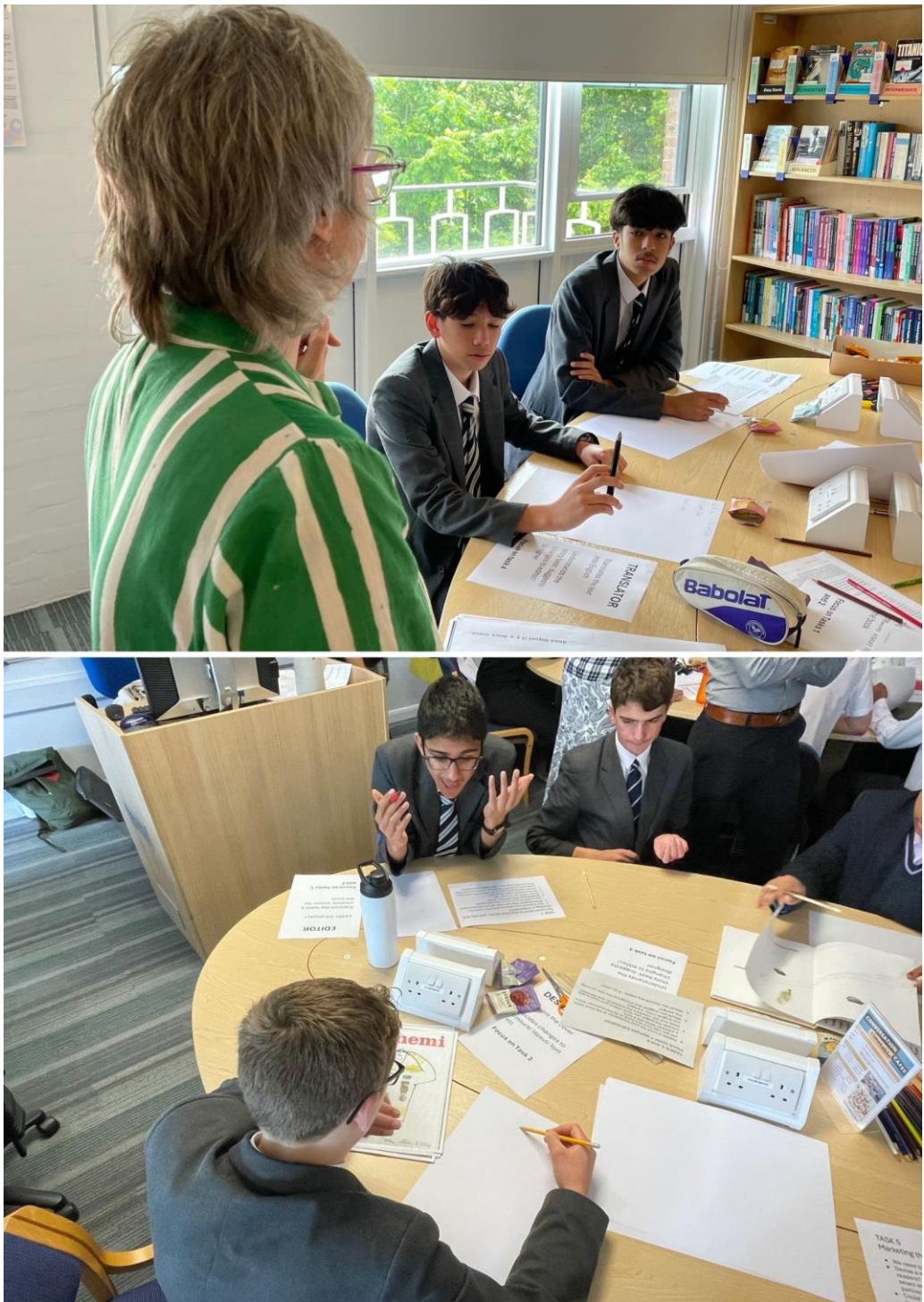
