The 100th Psalm is one of the most well-known Psalms of the Hebrew Bible. It encourages praise of Yahweh – the LORD – whose love and faithfulness extend through all generations. This version, The Old Hundredth, comes originally from the 1562 'Genevan Psalter', the hymn book of the radical Christian reformers in Geneva. It was rearranged and greatly elaborated by Ralph Vaughan Williams for the Coronation of Queen Elizabeth II, where it became the first recorded element of a British Coronation to require the congregation's participation. They had not been warned about the fanfares!

JERUSALEM

This poem by William Blake was probably written whilst the author was awaiting trial in Chichester for high treason (having been accused by a drunk soldier of saying that, 'Soldiers were all slaves').

The poem is part of Blake's 'Preface to Milton'. The lyrics may refer to a myth which suggests that when he was a teenager Jesus visited Britain with a relative (Joseph of Arimathea) who was said to have business interests in Cornish tin mines. There is no historical evidence supporting this story.

> And did those feet in ancient time, Walk upon England's mountains green: And was the holy Lamb of God, On England's pleasant pastures seen! And did the Countenance Divine, Shine forth upon our clouded hills? And was Jerusalem builded here, Among these dark Satanic Mills?

> Bring me my Bow of burning gold; Bring me my Arrows of desire: Bring me my Spear: O clouds unfold! Bring me my Chariot of fire! I will not cease from Mental Fight, Nor shall my Sword sleep in my hand: Till we have built Jerusalem, In England's green and pleasant Land.
