Reading School is entitled to expect that:

Students:

- Are punctual and attend regularly.
- Adhere to the school dress code.
- Work to the best of their ability.
- Complete their homework on time and meet deadlines.
- Take responsibility for their own learning, organisation and discipline.
- Are honest, polite and exhibit good behaviour at all times.
- Show respect for others and their possessions.
- Treat the school environment and facilities with respect.
- Participate to the best of their ability in school/house activities.
- Raise quickly any concerns or problems that they have, with us and their parents.
- Comply fully with the School's principles for promoting good behaviour and the responsibilities and requirements set out in its anti-drugs policy.
- Demonstrate commitment to the aims of the School to develop academic excellence and build good people through the School's approach to the curriculum.
- Demonstrate compliance and commitment to the behavioural requirements and expectations.

Parents:

- Support the School's ethos, core values and policies as set out in the School Prospectus and on the School website, with particular focus on belonging and well-being.
- Ensure regular and punctual attendance by your son and strictly avoid booking holidays in term time.

- Ensure your child comes to school with the appropriate uniform and equipment.
- Do your best to provide an appropriate environment and time at home to enable your child to complete homework.
- Monitor your child's homework, using the Student Planner and Parent Portal.
- Have positive, but realistic expectations of your child's ability
- Endeavour as far as possible to support the School's activities (parents' consultation evenings, sports fixtures, school trips and events) and encourage your child to do so too.
- Advise the school of problems/achievements/issues concerning your son.
- Promptly communicate with the student support team if there are any additional learning needs for your child.
- Reply to school communications and supply absence notes/relevant email communication promptly.
- Consider the advice from the School set out in its E-safety Policy and seek to ensure good practice in the home.
- Represent the School respectfully and with integrity both in person and online.
- Communicate and cooperate with the School if they have concerns regarding the harmful use of substances at Reading School.
- Support the behavioural expectations of the School.
